## Coastal Saltmarsh

The Coast Banksia Woodland site within the Waratah Bay-Shallow Inlet Coastal Reserve is surrounded by coastal saltmarsh. During high tides, salt water inundates areas within the project site and flows over the Roy Henderson trail. Coastal Saltmarsh comprises a series of zones, each with distinct plants. These defined areas of plant communities can be seen when walking along the trail and on the Inlet itself.

This indigenous plant information sheet identifies and illustrates coastal saltmarsh plants, both within the project area, and in the surrounding coastal saltmarsh. This sheet has been developed for a summer educational activity. It can be used in conjunction with Indigenous Plants sheets #1 and #2 which illustrate typical plants, both large and small, found within the project site.




