

Feedback Sought for Sandy Point Camping

South Gippsland Shire Council is inviting community members to provide their input into the future planning of a caravan and camping ground in Sandy Point.

The existing Sandy Point Caravan Park is too small with only ten camping sites available for short stay visitors and little room for expansion. It is also possible the site will be lost to residential subdivision in the future.

Following an investigation Council has identified a preferred site for the grounds to be an area of land west of Sandy Point. This would provide ample space and a good connection to beach access.

South Gippsland Shire Council's Strategic Planner Lyndal Peterson encouraged community members to share their opinion.

"Council is committed to hearing from the community and ensuring that any action taken is with consideration of their views. This feedback is vital to ensure that an informed decision can be made.

"Council is not intending to develop or operate a new caravan park facility on the identified land. This consultation seeks only to identify an appropriate site with community feedback considered," said Ms Peterson.
